M1 Garand History:

The M1 Garand was made in large numbers during World War II; approximately 5.4 million were made. They were used by every branch of the United States military. The rifle generally performed well. **General George S. Patton called it "the greatest battle implement ever devised."** The typical opponent of a US soldier during World War II was usually armed with a slower-firing bolt-action rifle (e.g. the Karabiner 98k for Germany, the Carcano M1891 for Italy, and the Type 38 or Type 99 Arisaka rifle for Japan). The impact of faster-firing infantry small arms in general soon stimulated both Allied and Axis forces to greatly increase their issue of semi- and fully automatic firearms then in production, as well as to develop new types of infantry firearms.

Rules: The *CMP Games Rifle Competition Rules* will apply. (see: www.thecmp.org). All other range safety rules will apply. Use of an ECI (Empty Chamber Indicator) is mandatory. No handling of firearms while scoring is being done. Use of ear protection is required on the firing, ready, and assembly lines.

Equipment: Any "as-issued" M-1 Garand or Unlimited Garand (.308 caliber).

Ground Mats, Coats, Gloves, Spotting scopes etc. are recommended. Web or leather service rifle slings allowed. Use of the sling is not allowed in Off-Hand Stage, but sling must be attached (parade style) to the rifle. It might be chilly, so dress accordingly.

Course of Fire: Competitors will be firing the CMP 35-Shot "Course A." Matches will be fired concurrently. No Alibis or Refires will be given.

¹ The 200-yard SR target, Rule 3.5.1 a), is used for all stages. Alternatively, all stages may be fired at 100 yards on the SR-1 target, Rule 3.5.1 b).
² Competitors are given a combined time limit of 15 minutes to fire a maximum of five sighting shots and 10 record shots in the prone position.
³ The time limit for the rapid-fire stage is 80 seconds for both semi-automatic rifles (M1 Garands) and manually operated rifles (Springfields and Vintage Military Rifles).

Rule 3.7.4: "Competitors who are 70 years of age or older or competitors who have a physical or medical condition or impairment that prevents them from moving or changing from standing to the firing position may request permission from the Range Officer to begin rapid-fire stages in the firing position. These competitors are eligible to win awards..."

Awards: CMP Award Pins. Gold, Silver, and Bronze award pins to competitors achieving "cut scores" as designated by 2023 CMP Rule Book

General Information: Competitors will perform scoring, Firing and other duties, as assigned.
